

Abstract guidance document

Title: Should be short and descriptive. Only capitalize the first word, acronyms, proper names and the first word after a colon. Do not put a period at the end of the title.

Author List: The presenting author's name should be underlined and listed first. Include the names of your research mentors and colleagues who contributed to the work. Your research mentor should approve the author list before submission.

Affiliations: List the affiliations of all authors as described in the template

Abstract: The main text is limited to 200 words and should introduce the research topic and describe the performed research. Provide an outline of the major findings and conclusions. The content of the abstract should be approved by your research mentor. Here are some helpful hints:

- Provide the motivation for your work by framing the research.
- You do not have to include all your work or results.
- Do not include literature references to other published work in your abstract. The references should be included in your presentation.
- Avoid the use of "I" and "we".

Acknowledgments: List any individuals, organizations and funding agencies that helped conduct, execute, or fund the research. Your research mentor should approve the list.

Figures: Figures are optional. If needed, please limit your abstract to one figure. Please include a figure caption that briefly describes the figure.
